VOLUNTEERS IN POLICE SERVICE

Program Disqualifiers



The Hobbs Police Department will automatically disqualify any individual who has at any time:

- Been convicted of a Felony or any offense that would qualify as a Felony under New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1978. (Applicant may choose to bring information to the VIPS Program Coordinator as a waiver to this requirement.)
- Used illegal Marijuana in the past three (3) years.
- Sold any illegal drug or substance or prescription medication illegally
- Used illegal or dangerous drugs in the past ten (10) years.
- Been arrested for any crime or charged with a major traffic offense (DUI, DWI, Suspension of License, or Driving without insurance) during the past year.
- Lied during any part of the application process.

Applicants may also be disqualified, after review, at the discretion of the VIPS Coordinator for the following reasons:

- A physical or mental inability to perform the required duties of a volunteer
- Excessive traffic violations
- Drug or alcohol misuse or abuse
- Unlawful sexual conduct
- Any discharge from the US Military that is other than honorable
- Excessive indebtedness or a demonstrated unwillingness to honor debt
- Any conduct that would jeopardize public opinion of the VIPS Program or embarrass the Hobbs Police Department

There is no appeal for disqualification from the VIPS Program.
